

Chariton County Farmers' Market

Rules and Regulations

1. The market shall be known as the Chariton County Farmer's Market.
2. The market in Salisbury will be open; each Friday from 9 a.m. until 12 p.m. to bonafied growers and craftsmen with Chariton and adjoining counties.
3. Members may pull into the market at anytime prior to opening of the market for the purpose of setting up their display.
4. Products which may be sold include: All vegetables and fruits, arts and crafts, specialty products (honey, syrup, and molasses.) Eggs, live animals, live fish, and frozen meat may be sold so long as the vendor provides written proof that the products meet or exceed the current State of Missouri regulations. Baked goods, locally produced and noted with a sign stating ingredients, and that they were baked in a kitchen not subject to Missouri State inspection are allowed. Wholesalers and growers that are not members of the market shall not be allowed to sell in the market. Local producers of acceptable products shall be allowed once they become a member.
5. Each member shall be responsible for furnishing or setting up his/her own table.
6. Daily rental fee shall be set by the Board. Yearly rental shall be at the rate of \$10 per year per space. Each vendor shall be limited to two paid spaces.
7. No one shall be permitted to sell on the market until the Market Manager and or the Board of Directors approve his/her membership.
8. Members must carry their membership card while selling on the market. Daily members must carry their paid receipt. A master list will be maintained by the Market Master.
9. Each regular member shall have an assigned spot on the market and on a first come basis for all others.
10. No member shall have the right to sub-lease, sell, transfer or permit a non-member to use his space, however any member can sell another member's products as long as they both pay fees.
11. Members are responsible for reporting expected items to be offered at the next market for advertising purposes.
12. Each member is expected to keep his space free from refuse and the market area free from refuse during market hours. The Market Manager will report untidy conditions of the market area to the Mayor should they be left by previous users of the area.
13. Each member shall remain on his own market space when selling his/her products. Sales shall

be conducted in an orderly business manner. No shouting or other objectionable means of soliciting trade shall be tolerated.

14. Each member agrees to make his stand and products offered for sale as attractive as possible. Quality and fresh products are important.
15. The Board shall select a Market Manager, whose duty is shall be to collect daily fees, assign market stands and in general supervise the market. He/She shall be responsible to the Board and shall report any violations of the rules to the Board.
16. Advertising the market shall be in the hands of the Board of Directors. They shall advertise the market for the benefit of the members as finances permit.
17. The above rules and regulations are to be enforced by the Board of Directors of the market, who is responsible for the management of the market.
18. All selling on the market agree to abide by the above rules and regulations. The Board of Directors reserves the right to cancel the privileges of any member who willfully violates these rules.
19. All rules and regulations are subject to change by a full discussion and vote of the Board of Directors.
